Charity of the Year 2025

This year we are supporting The Archie Foundation – Archie's Child Bereavement Services. Archie's Child Bereavement Services offers support to families and professionals working with children and young people free of charge within Grampian, Tayside, and the Highlands and Orkney, giving them individual, tailored support to help with bereavement. Many referrals are received from schools and health professionals.

This charity is very personal to us as our Finance Manager, Loretta Ross, sadly lost her husband, George, very suddenly at the end of January this year., leaving behind Loretta and her two children, Lucas (10) and Keira (8). Prior to having her children, Loretta was Nursery Manager for eight years at our nursery in Inverurie.

Deborah Mathers, who worked previously with us, and volunteers with the charity, bringing it to our attention, also lost her own husband very suddenly a few years ago. Deborah's two boys were also very young at the time.

The charity recognises that every child is different, and believes that with appropriate support, information and guidance, all children and young people will manage their grief. ACBS supports children who have experienced bereavement no matter the relationship.

The Archie Foundation was formed in 2000 to support the building of a new Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital which opened in 2014, and the Grampian Child Bereavement network joined the Archie Foundation in 2019.

We really welcome your support throughout the year, as this charity really means a lot to us.

Events we have planned over the coming months are as follows: -

Pizza making – During w/c 5th May, we will be making pizzas with the children for you to take home and cook. Order forms have been handed out for this, should you wish to purchase any. Please note, it will be your own child who makes your order. If your child has allergies, staff will support with this.

Learning Experiences

Little Bunnies

The Little Bunnies created some lovely fire pictures whilst learning about Fire Fighters. They used forks to dip into yellow, red and orange paint before dragging them across their paper. They looked fantastic!



The boys and girls have been getting creative whilst out in the garden.

They have been creating pictures of their own smiles by using the pens to mark make, and glue to stick on small pieces of paper to resemble their teeth.



The children enjoyed using the mirror to have a look at their smiles and teeth. There were some beautiful smiles going on! They also stuck their tongues out to add this onto their picture!

The Little Bunnies took part in some spring themed yoga! The children were able to copy the poses such as 'hopping like bunnies', 'spinning like flowers in the wind' and 'rolling like Easter eggs!' They followed the instructions so well!



Cheeky Monkeys

The Cheeky Monkeys have been learning about road safety whilst out in the garden.

The boys and girls took part in a 'crossing' role play, where they were learning to stop, look and listen for cars before crossing the road.

The children had lots of fun doing this before they crossed over the zebra crossing. They were even using the bikes and trikes to act out as the traffic.

The boys and girls were very excited about this as he took in some props which included the ground control panels and some headphones which the children got a turn at using! It was so much fun!





We learnt all about Africa, and we discovered that some people in tribes wear different masks. The children got very creative at the mark making table using the paper plates and different resources to design their own tribal masks. They all looked amazing!

Trips/Visits


