### Learning Experiences

#### Little Bunnies

This term, the Little Bunnies have been exploring Safari Animals as a topic - creating sensory tuff trays - exploring touch, smell and sound. The children have been learning the animal sounds, textures of different animals, going on animal hunts, exploring animal footprints and creating lots of artwork for their topic wall - including zebras and tigers! They have also been reading Safari related stories and using the puppets to relate to them.

The children have also explored 'People Who Help Us'. We have created different role play areas such as a doctor's surgery, a vet practice, dental practice, and the children thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as different roles in different jobs. This then led to the children exploring more local jobs where we decided to open a restaurant and hairdresser!

During our 'All About Me' topic, the children created their own jigsaws, made handprints, and used the blocks to 'build themselves'. We have also started to create an 'All about Me' wall display on the topic wall.

The children have spent much time outside in the garden, and they have also been out for walks, had opportunities to bake, and they always enjoy our fantastic sensory trays.

Below is a selection of tuff trays the children have been exploring throughout the term.



## **Busy Bees**

The 2-5's have been very busy in the garden, planting and caring for various plants, which include vegetables and fruits! They have been keen to get involved when looking after our tomato plants, eagerly watching them grow, and they have learnt about all the herbs in our herb garden. All the children understood what plants and flowers need to help them grow.

The children have studied the life cycle of butterflies, tadpoles and ladybirds. They also hatched their own ladybirds! looking after them in a terrarium for three weeks before releasing them into the garden!

Our pre-school Graduation was a huge hit, where we were joined by a Piper, and everyone watched the rehearsal - joining in with the songs! The children also enjoyed a summer party together before all the school leavers left for their new adventure. They are very much missed, but we know they are ready for their next transition up to school.

During our Transport and Space topics, the children learnt how vehicles move and what each part of the vehicle is for, and what it does. Eg the brakes make the car slow down/stop! They learnt about the planets, and the children were able to understand the role of the stars, the moon and the sun, and they were very keen to role play with rockets!

Our garden always has various play opportunities for the children, and the mud kitchen is very well used, along with our new bike rack!

#### Trips/Visits

The Busy Bee children visit Garioch Gymnastics every second Thursday during term time, and Laura from Flashdance in Aberdeen also comes to see the children every Tuesday afternoon during school term time as well.

At the Wee Green Space, the older children continue to enjoy outdoor snacks, bug hunts and exploring the outdoors. We have enjoyed walks to the centre of Kintore to visit the book bench, and we have also popped into the local shops! The children have loved the visits to the pond where they can view the wildlife.

The Busy Bee room visited the Gonks of Gardenshillock - searching for fairies, gonks and gnomes in an amazing outdoor space - inspiring us to develop our own mud kitchen area. The children explored the open space where there was a poly tunnel, story building kits, different gnome houses, and they read the Gonks of Gardenshillock book before they left to attend the trip. Great fun was had by all children and staff, and we would highly recommend a visit!

We continue to develop our use of loose parts and the different areas within the playroom - rotating and adding to each area weekly!
